TACOMA, WA – At its annual meeting on Wednesday, December 14, 2016, the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation Board of Directors approved recommendations to add Julie Anderson, Phil Carter and Ali Modarres to its ranks.

- Julie Anderson has served as the Pierce County Auditor since 2009. She is responsible for elections, licensing services, a variety of public records and animal control. Julie is a highly-organized and determined leader known for excellent communication and the ability solve problems.
- Phil Carter currently serves as a regional executive director for the YMCA of Pierce and Kitsap Counties. He oversees operations at the Morgan Family YMCA, the Tacoma Center YMCA and the University Y in Tacoma. Phil grew up in Tacoma; he graduated from Wilson High School in 1979.
- Ali Modarres is the Director of Urban Studies at University of Washington Tacoma. He is a
 geographer and landscape architect, specializing in urban planning and policy. He has written
 extensively about social geography, transportation planning, and urban development issues in
 American cities.

GTCF's board also ratified its slate of officers for 2017, confirming Sheri Tonn as Board Chair, Dwight Williams as Board Vice Chair, Mary Thomas as Board Secretary and Gary Brooks as Board Treasurer.
