Dear Fundholder of Greater Tacoma Community Foundation,

We are pleased to share your Quarterly Fund Statement for the period April 1 through June 30, 2017.

The fund that you established with GTCF is invested in our Socially Responsive (SRI) Pool which was established in February 2016. The SRI Pool integrates Socially Responsive Investing factors into the security selection process for a portion of our endowed assets.

Global stock markets continued with strong performance during the second quarter. As the markets advanced, so did GTCF's SRI Pool, posting a +3.1% return for the quarter compared to the target weighted benchmark of +2.1%.

Because of gifts from you and other donors, GTCF can maximize positive change in our community. Throughout 2017, we are bringing together the community to inspire and support action that improves lives locally.

In May, we hosted national philanthropy expert and author of Inspired Philanthropy, Tracy Gary, to speak with three different groups who are vital to building Pierce County's future: professional advisors, nonprofits, and donors. Tracy reminded everyone, "You are in the HOPE business". Tracy's vision reinforces GTCF's belief in the power of individual philanthropy, which is, "You have the ability to change lives and transform communities."

In July, more than one-hundred community leaders – from businesses and nonprofits to educational institutions and agencies – gathered to learn and share insights into improving economic security for women in Pierce County at our first Women's Economic Opportunity Workshop. This was just the


beginning of a new Initiative from GTCF's Fund for Women and Girls. A second workshop will keep the work growing in August.

Also, this summer, the Wallace Foundation awarded Tacoma Public Schools and GTCF a shared four-year grant as part of the Partnerships for Social and Emotional Learning Initiative. Together, we will focus on helping elementary school children in Tacoma develop positive social and emotional skills, such as self-control, persistence, teamwork, and goal-setting, which are linked to success in school, career, and life. Tacoma is one of only six communities in the country to be selected to participate in this Initiative, which fosters collaboration between both the school system and out-of-school providers.

On top of all that, we celebrated the 10th Foundation of Art Award by naming 10 local artists as winners. Their work will be featured in a Spaceworks Gallery exhibition from September 4 to October 19, 2017.
